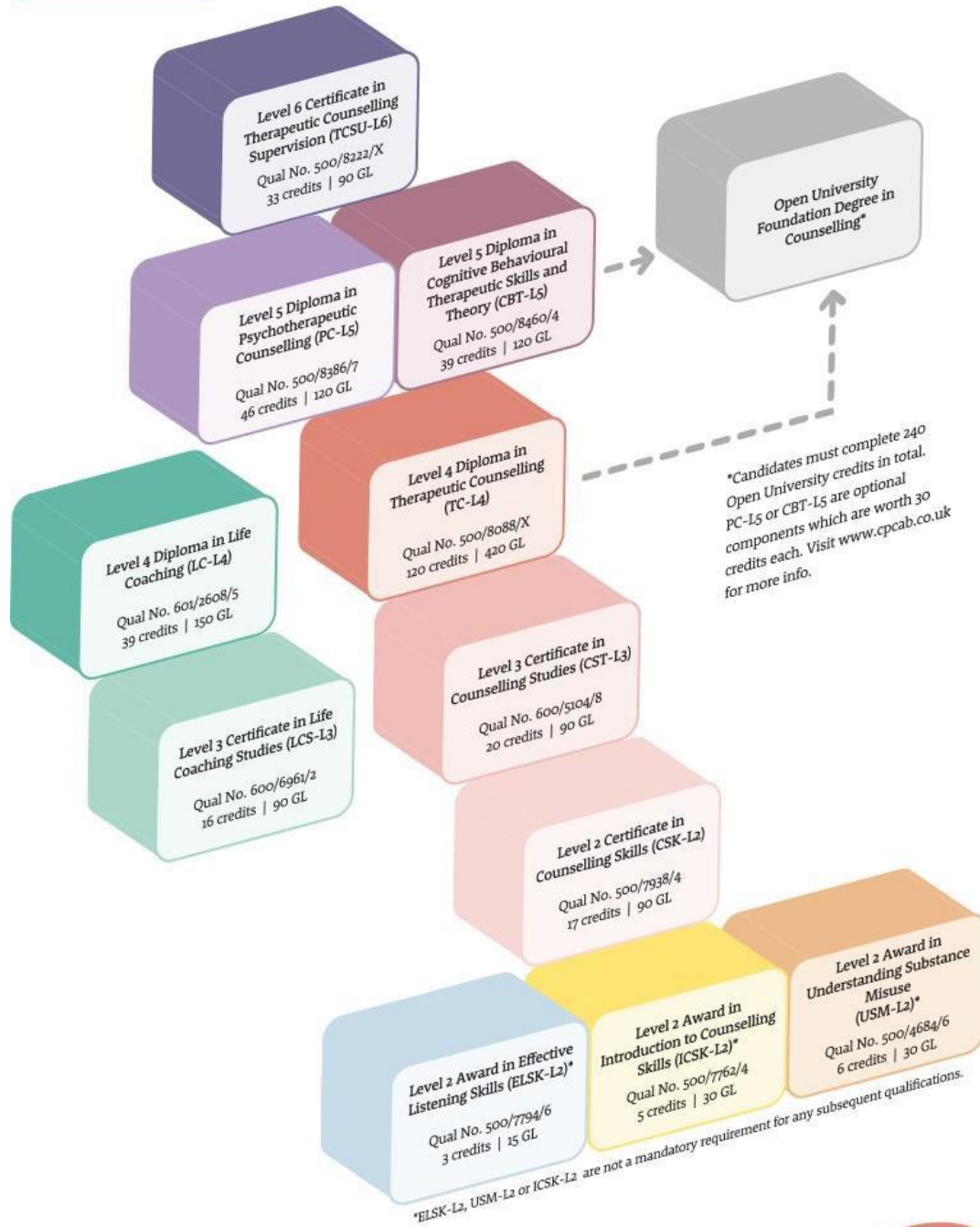

Additional Qualification Requirements	<p>Personal counselling – a minimum of 10 hours face-to-face personal therapy during the course, consistent with the counselling model/s being offered – in practice this is usually more than 10 hours.</p> <p>Client work – a minimum of 100 hours formally-contracted counselling (one-to-one) with at least 5 different clients in an agency</p>

setting. Cancellations and non-attends do not count towards this total.

Supervision – candidates require clinical supervision for their agency client work. In addition, candidates require 30-50 hours of Group Training Supervision (GTS) as part of the course.
